## Pine Rockland Plants for your Garden

Scientific Name	Common Name	Notes
<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>	Butterfly weed	Orange flowers that attract butterflies and hummingbirds. 18-36 inches. Self-seeding. Part to full sun.
<i>Coreopsis leavenworthii</i>	Tickseed	Florida state wildflower. Yellow daisy-like flower, 18-36 inches. Self-seeding annual. Grow in full sun.
<i>Flaveria linearis</i>	Yellowtop	Clusters of small yellow flowers, 24-48 inches tall. Perennial. Part to full sun.
<i>Galliardia pulchella</i>	Indian Blanket	Red flowers with yellow-tipped petals, 12-24 inches tall. Annual or short-lived perennial, reseeds easily. Grow in full sun.
<i>Amorpha crenulata</i>	Crenulate Leadplant	Small shrub with compound leaflets and white-purple flower spikes in spring/summer. Endangered.
<i>Ardisia escallanoides</i>	Marlberry	Medium shrub or small tree; dark shiny leaves; small, fragrant white flowers; black fruits are edible. Full sun.
<i>Byrsonima lucida</i>	Locust berry	Very attractive shrub or small tree. Racemes of white and pink flowers; yellow fruits are edible and attractive to wildlife.
<i>Callicarpa americana</i>	Beautyberry	Shrub 4-8 ft, insignificant flowers but very showy clusters of purple fruit. Part to full sun. Good food source for birds.
<i>Chiococca parvifolia</i>	Snowberry	Small shrub with white flowers and white berries throughout the year. Likes full sun.
<i>Lantana involucrata</i>	Wild Sage	Small woody shrub, small white flowers, 24-48 inches. Full sun. Attracts butterflies.
<i>Myrsine floridana</i>	Myrsine	Large shrub or small tree; small inconspicuous flowers; year-round fruits are attractive to birds.
<i>Randia aculeate</i>	Indigoberry	Medium shrub. Tubular white flowers are very fragrant. White fruits attractive to birds.
<i>Stachytarpheta jamaicensis</i>	Blue Porterweed	Small shrub, bluish-purple flower spikes, 12-36 inches. Perennial. Part to full sun. Attracts butterflies.
<i>Tetrazygia bicolor</i>	West Indian Lilac	Med-lg shrub, showy white flowers, purple-black berries; part to full sun.
<i>Jacquemontia curtissii</i>	Pineland Jacquemontia	Small, prostrate vine. White saucer-shaped flowers throughout year. Sun loving. longevity dependent on periodic fires.
<i>Passiflora suberosa</i>	Corky-stemmed passionflower	Slender vine, dark green lobed leaves, small white-green flowers, dark blue-purple fruits; attracts butterflies
<i>Pinus elliottii</i>	Slash Pine	Large coniferous tree; solitary trunk, scaly red-brown bark.
<i>Serenoa repens</i>	Saw Palmetto	Clumping fan palm, 3-8 ft; part to full sun.
<i>Zamia floridana</i>	Coontie	Only native cycad in Florida; 1-5 ft; part to full sun; sole food source for Atala butterfly.
<i>Muhlenbergia capillaris</i>	Muhly grass	Ornamental grass, 2-3 ft; feather-like, pink flower spikes; part to full sun.
