"In high school I got to manage the herbarium in the school" he says, and that's what led him to be interested in botany.

Although he still has no preference as to what aspect of botany he would like to focus on in the future, he wants to eventually go for his PhD and become a professor. "This is an under appreciated field, but important and interesting," he explained.
